THESE ARE YOUR RIGHTS

All members of the campus community have the right to have reported incidents addressed according to the published college procedures.

Reporting parties have the right to notify law enforcement of incidents and to receive assistance from campus personnel in doing so.

Reporting parties, their supporters, and witnesses have a right to be free from retaliation.

Reporting parties have the right to seek orders of protection, no-contact orders, restraining orders, or similar lawful orders issues by criminal, civil, or tribal courts, and may seek the help of Campus Security Services in requesting and/or enforcing.

Department Descriptions and External Resources

Diversity and Inclusion Services is focused on creating a campus that is inclusive and accepting of differences while celebrating and supporting uniqueness of all students.

Employment Connections serves students and graduates of FVTC with job searching, resources, and employment opportunities to prepare you for the working field.

Veterans Resource Center serves the veteran student community to assist with counseling and advising, academic planning, and financial benefits education.

Campus Care Clinic is focused on prevention and care for illness or injury for current students, college employees, and their spouses along with their children 2 years or older.

Financial Aid office provides financial aid information, opportunities, and eligibility to assist students with ways to meet the educational cost.

LifeLINE Assistance Program is a confidential platform to assist students with alcohol & drug abuse as it pertains to relationships. These are only a few of the issues students can discuss with counselors.

FVTC Food Pantry is available to all enrolled students regardless of income. Students may come once per week to obtain a total of 8 items (7 food items + 1 personal care item).

Student Life is a place where students can go and relax. They provide students the opportunity to participate in activities, events, leadership development, clubs, and Student Government.
