

# FVTC High School Articulation

*The alignment of high school and college curricula to create opportunities for high school students to take college level coursework in order to get a head start on earning college credits while still in high school. Two of the options for High School articulations are advanced standing (AS) and Dual Credit (DC).\**

<b>Assessments &amp; Grading</b>	High School requirements reviewed and approved by FVTC faculty	FVTC requirements
