Applying for VA Education Benefits

Federal

1. Apply online at www.va.gov.
2. Submit the following items to FVTC Veterans Resource Center:
 - a. Discharge Papers (DD-214)
 - b. Federal Certificate of Eligibility (COE)
 - c. Kicker Documentation (if applicable)
 - d. VA form 22-1995
(only if you've previously used GI benefits at another institution)
3. Licensing and Certification information:

Wisconsin GI Bill

1. Apply online at <https://applications.dva.wisconsin.gov/myWisVets>
2. Submit the following documents to FVTC Veterans Resource Center:
 - a. WDVA 2029 Form — the state will submit a WDVA 2031 (Certificate of Eligibility) to FVTC
 - b. Veteran: DD-214 (member 4), spouse (marriage certificate), children (birth certificate)

What You Need to Know About

Using VA Education Benefits at FVTC

1. After enrolling in either an associate degree, technical diploma or certificate program, you must submit a certification request form to your school certifying officials prior to each semester.
2. You must also notify Veterans Resource Center of changes to your schedule immediately. Failure to do so could slow down your payment which will cause repayment issues.
3. Make sure all of your courses are in your Program Plan. VA will only pay for courses that are required for graduation.
4. VA pays from the start date to the end date for your courses. If you are enrolled in short/accelerated courses, your payments may change throughout the semester.
5. If eligible for book stipends, be prepared to pay for your books out-of-pocket. The direct deposit may not be deposited in time.
6. We encourage all student veterans to apply for financial aid by completing the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). For more information, visit www.fvtc.edu/FinancialAid.

Wisconsin GI Bill	<p>The WI GI Bill provides up to a 100% waiver of tuition (program and material fees) for eligible veterans and eligible dependents of deceased (in line of duty) or 30% or more disabled (service connected) veterans for up to 8 full-time semesters or 128 credits. NOTE: The WI GI Bill does not waive student activity fees, parking fees or any additional fees.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The benefit recipient must reside in Wisconsin. • Effective 1/1/2014, student must maintain a cumulative 2.0 GPA. • Qualifying children must be 17 up to 26 years old. • Application must be submitted to the FVTC certifying official and the WDVA by the 14th calendar day of the semester start date. • Benefit varies with federal post-9/11 eligibility.
VetEd (Reimbursement Grant)	<p>The VetEd program provides reimbursement following successful completion of full-time or part-time coursework.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Must first apply for the WI GI Bill. • The reimbursement grant application must be completed no later than 60 days after the start of the term. • Visit your County Veterans Service Officer for assistance in applying or visit www.dva.state.wi.us.
Retraining Grant	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Recently unemployed or underemployed veterans may receive up to \$3,000 per year if they have a financial need while being retrained for employment. The amount of the grant is determined by the applicant's financial need as calculated by WDVA. • In some instances, spouses and dependent children of deceased Wisconsin veterans also may be eligible for this grant. • To qualify, the applicant must have been involuntarily laid off or discharged (not due to willful misconduct) within one year preceding the date that WDVA receives the grant application. The applicant must have been employed for at least six consecutive months with the same employer or in the same or similar occupations. At least one day of that employment must have been within that year. • The applicant must be engaged in a structured on-the-job training program or be currently enrolled in a technical education program that will be completed within two years of the date the application is received at WDVA and that will lead to gainful employment. Course work toward a college degree does not qualify as retraining. • An applicant may receive a second Retraining Grant no sooner than one year after the first grant was issued. No applicant may receive more than two Retraining Grants. The applicant may not receive a Retraining Grant and another WDVA education grant for the same period. • Veterans must apply for the grant through their county veterans service office.
