Fox Crossing Fire Department (FCFD) was established in 1938, serving the residents of Northern Winnebago County with a population of 19,084 operating out of two Fire Stations (Station 40 and Station 41). Four Engines, one Ladder, one Rescue and three Command Cars handle 1,100 calls for service annually. FCFD is one of 270 Internationally Accredited Agencies in the world; 11% of the U.S. population is protected by an accredited agency. Our Department operates with a combination staffing model. This unique staffing model allows opportunity for both Part-Time and Paid-On-Call applicants to be a part of the department.

Paid-On-Call (POC) firefighters are the back bone of Fox Crossing Fire Department. These are dedicated community members serving in the capacity of Firefighters, Driver Operators and Company Officers. This group of employees are assigned a pager and will respond from home to the fire station when a call comes in. No experience is necessary for POC firefighters and we will always train the right candidate.

Part-Time firefighters are another part of our staffing model. These employees work at the Fire Station during the week M-F, 0800-1630, and/or on the weekends on 12-hour shifts. The part-time firefighters are responsible for handling all calls that come in during their shift. Day to day work is completed at each station including cleaning, vehicle checks, training, building inspections and maintenance.

The recruit training program consists of 40 hours of training before being assigned a mentor and a task book to be completed. The FVTC internship program (400 hours) runs parallel to our training program and provides an opportunity to earn money while working to complete the internship. Experience is the number one thing that firefighters receive while employed at Fox Crossing. This experience is invaluable for those that are seeking full-time employment as a firefighter.

The Department also has an 501(c)3 organization called The Fox Crossing Fire Association Inc. that is responsible for all fund raising events. All current members of the FCFD are eligible for membership.
