# WAICU-WTCS COURSE CREDIT TRANSFER AGREEMENT July 6, 2020

THIS COURSE CREDIT TRANSFER AGREEMENT (this "Agreement") is made by and between the Wisconsin Association of Independent Colleges and Universities, Inc., a Wisconsin non-stock corporation ("WAICU"), and the Wisconsin Technical College System ("WTCS").

## I. Purpose and Rationale

WAICU has developed this Agreement to ensure a smooth transfer process for Wisconsin technical college students who wish to continue their education at a WAICU-member college or university (each, a "WAICU Member"). WTCS and WAICU ("the Parties") recognize that student transfer from WTCS to Wisconsin's private, nonprofit colleges and universities is key to addressing workforce shortages, providing access to a baccalaureate education for students from all backgrounds, and facilitating timely completion for students changing their academic or career focus. The Parties also recognize that this Agreement builds on the articulation agreements that many WAICU Members and WTCS districts have already developed.

This Agreement establishes the procedures governing the transfer of credits in one or more courses (listed in Appendix B) for students who are enrolled as Wisconsin Technical College students and who wish to transfer from a WTCS district to a WAICU Member. This Agreement does not guarantee admission to a specific institution or to a specific major within an institution.

WAICU Members that adopt this Agreement ("WAICU Member Participants") do so for the benefit of the transferring student so that the educational experience is more efficient, easier to understand, and simpler to navigate, while optimizing credit transfer and shortening the time to degree completion. The eligible WAICU Member Participants and WTCS districts are listed in Appendix A.

A WAICU Member Participant's president (or authorized representative) must sign a separate Participation Agreement with the WAICU central office (signed by the President of WAICU), which acknowledges that the WAICU Member Participant agrees to adhere to the requirements of this Agreement. WAICU members who have not signed the agreement with the WAICU office are not eligible to participate in the WAICU-WTCS Course credit transfer agreement.

WAICU Member Participants recognize college transfer programs with the professional integrity of other regionally accredited post-secondary institutions. All courses approved for college transfer under this Agreement will be taught by faculty who meet Higher Learning Commission ("HLC") credential requirements.

#### II. Agreement Policies and Provisions

- 1. Term; Revisions. This Agreement is effective as of the date first written above and shall expire on the second anniversary of that date (the "Term") unless sooner terminated. After the second anniversary, the Term of this Agreement shall be automatically renewed for successive periods of two years each (each a "Renewal Term") unless either Party delivers written notice of non-renewal to the other at least one hundred eighty (180) days prior to the end of the Term or then-current Renewal Term. This Agreement may be amended or revised upon the written agreement of each Party.
- 2. Administration. The WAICU (central office) administrator, in cooperation with the WTCS (system office) will maintain and administer this Agreement on behalf of the WAICU Member Participants and WTCS districts. WAICU, with oversight by the WAICU President, will serve as the central contact for all WAICU Member Participants' questions, concerns, or changes related to this transfer initiative. The WAICU central office will update the WTCS central office from time to time with the names of the confirmed WAICU Member Participants.
- 3. Adding Courses. The WTCS courses transferrable pursuant to this Agreement are listed in Appendix B. With WAICU Member Participant approval, additional courses may be added to this Agreement upon written agreement of WAICU (central office) and WTCS (system office). WAICU will notify each WAICU Member Participant's President and Vice President/Chief Academic Officer(s) of such changes.
- 4. Removing Courses. Modifications to the courses in <u>Appendix B</u> that will result in the elimination of a course from the Agreement may not be made during the academic year for which the Agreement is in effect, unless agreed upon in writing by both WAICU central office and WTCS central office leads.
- 5. Notification of Changes. Prior to each subsequent academic year (by July 1), the WAICU central office and the WTCS central office will provide updates to their respective sector/system Vice Presidents/Chief Academic Officer(s), and in the case of WAICU to each WAICU Member Participant's Vice President/Chief Academic Officer. These updates will summarize any modifications to courses in <a href="Appendix B">Appendix B</a> of this Agreement for the subsequent academic year, which shall be memorialized in a new Appendix B or an amendment thereto.
- 6. Curriculum. All 16 WTCS districts offer the same curriculum, so WAICU and WAICU Member Participants only need to evaluate the courses once for the purpose of this Agreement. WTCS (system office) agrees to notify WAICU (central office) of significant curricular or policy changes in a timely manner.
- Transferred Credits. The course transfer credits will satisfy general education requirements at the receiving WAICU Member Participant institution when applicable. The WAICU

Member Participant must transfer in the course as a direct equivalent, when offered, not an elective. If the WAICU Member Participant's curriculum does NOT offer a WTCS course listed in Appendix B, that course may transfer in as an elective.

- 8. Grades and Completion Dates. In order for these courses to transfer, the WTCS student must have completed the course(s) within the last ten (10) academic years from the date the student is admitted to a WTCS district campus. WAICU Member Participants will require a minimum grade of "C" (2.0 on a 4.0 scale) or better for the course(s) to transfer, unless published by the WAICU Member Participant. WAICU Member Participants will accept a WTCS institution "Pass" or "Credit" for transfer as long "Pass" equals a "C" or higher and the scale is annotated on the student transcript. The WAICU Member Participants will publish any higher standards and the programs to which these higher standards apply. The student must meet the respective WAICU Member Participant's admission requirements.
- 9. Advising. WAICU Member Participants will provide academic advising to WTCS students inquiring about WAICU Member Participant courses in this Agreement.
  - a. Students will be connected with the appropriate WAICU Member Participant advisor prior to transfer, and they should connect with their appropriate WTCS campus transfer office as well.
  - b. WAICU central office will work closely with the WTCS central office to carry out this Agreement. WAICU will encourage WAICU Member Participants to work closely with WTCS Transfer Coordinators on implementation.
  - c. WAICU Member Participants and WTCS campus contacts will share materials, catalogs, and other information to facilitate learners' understanding of requirements and programs.
- 10. Marketing. Any marketing of this Agreement will be subject to the prior approval of both Parties and will adhere to each Party's standards for the use of its name and logo. In addition:
  - a. Both Parties will promote the initiative on their respective websites.
  - b. Each WAICU Member Participant must acknowledge the WAICU and WTCS central offices as the umbrella organizations for this transfer initiative.
  - c. Each WAICU Member Participant will assume responsibility for appropriate marketing to reach its student population, as recommended by the WAICU central office.
  - d. Each WTCS district will assume responsibility for appropriate marketing to reach its student population, as recommended by the WTCS central office.
- 11. Accreditation. Both Parties agree that failure of WAICU Member Participants or WTCS technical colleges to maintain regional accreditation will be grounds for termination of the Agreement.

#### **WAICU-WTCS Course Credit Transfer Agreement**

- 12. Finances; No Partnership. No financial implication concerning the transfer or exchange of cash, equipment, or real estate is intended or implied by this Agreement. WAICU Member Participants and WTCS colleges are separate and independent entities and intend to remain so. This Agreement does not constitute a legal partnership among the Parties.
- 13. Effect of Termination. WTCS students who apply to and are accepted to a WAICU Member Participant's district prior to the termination date will be permitted to transfer credits under the Agreement terms.
- 14. Impact on Other Articulation Agreements. This Agreement is in addition to existing agreements and serves as a "minimum" course transfer agreement. It is not intended to replace any individual articulation agreement between a WTCS district and a WAICU Member Participant which would allow additional courses to transfer into a specific program of study.
